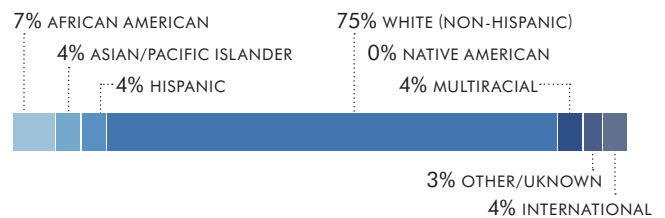

UNDERGRADUATE GENDER DISTRIBUTION FALL 2009



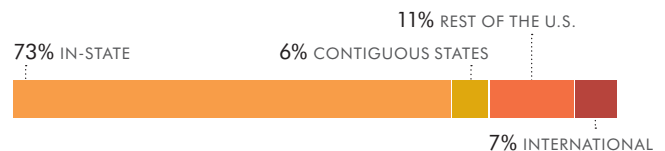

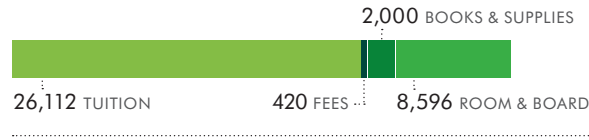
NEW STUDENT GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION³ FALL 2009



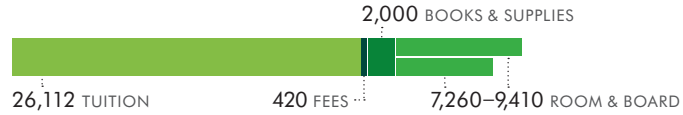

ON-CAMPUS \$35,792-37,942 TOTAL



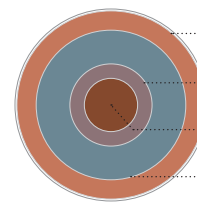

The ability to think *and* do is an art form. At Columbus College of Art & Design, we call it applied creativity. CCAD helps students develop not just their creative abilities, but every part of their intellect. New students here are met with skilled professional faculty, the best studio facilities, a well-rounded (but studio-centered) curriculum, and robust, individualized career services. They leave ready to make an impact. Our alumni influence trends, tell stories, and shape ideas throughout the United States and around the world.

CCAD's compact urban campus is centered on a quad bordered by gardens. Resources include professional studios for each major area of study; an active exhibitions program that brings international artists and artwork to campus throughout the year; a Visiting Artists program of weekly lectures by accomplished artists, designers, and other creative professionals; ample off-campus study opportunities; and a Career Services office that helps students plan for and secure their future careers.

The two most recent additions are the CCAD Design Studios on Broad, a historic auto dealership renovated to house the Industrial Design, Fashion Design, and MFA programs; and the Design Square Apartments, an award-winning, apartment-style residence hall.

NOTE 1: "Full-Time Equivalent" is the common way to measure the relative size of colleges. This adjusts for differences in the percentage of part-time students (or faculty). For example: one full-time student = 1 FTE; three half-time students = 1.5 FTE, etc. NOTE 2: Retention & graduation rates are calculated using "First-Time, Full-Time Freshmen" as required by the U.S. Department of Education. In schools with large transfer populations, these rates can vary quite a bit from year to year. NOTE 3: Geographic distribution is reported for first-time degree/certificate-seeking undergraduates. NOTE 4: Includes all institutional scholarships and grants, but does not include College Work Study or third party awards. NOTE 5: Data presented is drawn from the most recent school year available.
