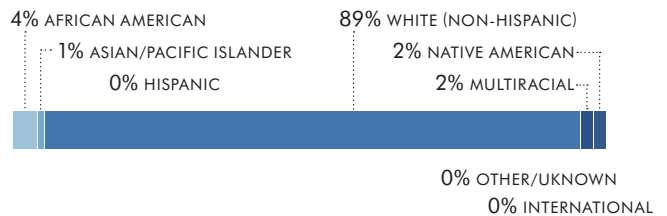

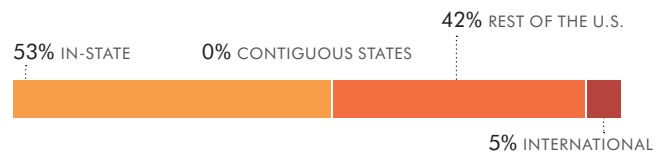

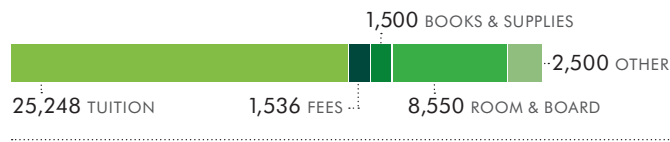
NEW STUDENT GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION³ FALL 2010

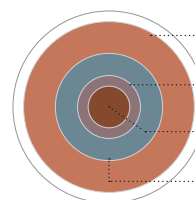

Walking onto the campus of Lyme Academy College of Fine Arts, you quickly discover a college of art like no other. The difference is in our inspiring, natural landscape, small class sizes and close relationships built between students and faculty. We are unique in our history as an Academy and our future as innovators of contemporary figurative and representational art and illustration.

At Lyme Academy College, the studio is the center of your daily life. Our rural location, excellent facilities and dedicated faculty offer the artist a completely immersive studio experience, balanced by a strong liberal arts curriculum. Student exhibitions, trips to artists' studios and museums, and an exceptional Visiting Artist Program complement the student experience. Our faculty consists of a diverse body of accomplished, working artists who work one-on-one with students throughout the program.

The College offers majors in Drawing, Painting, Sculpture and Illustration, and each is firmly anchored in the traditions and practices of figurative and representational art. As seniors, students complete a two-semester course in which they develop and hone a professional studio practice through the generation of an independent body of work. Seniors receive semi-private studio space and a Senior Studio Exhibition in the College galleries. Also offered is a minor in Art History, a three-year Certificate in Painting or Sculpture, and a Post-Baccalaureate Certificate with a concentration in Painting, Sculpture or Drawing.

NOTE 1: "Full-Time Equivalent" is the common way to measure the relative size of colleges. This adjusts for differences in the percentage of part-time students (or faculty). For example: one full-time student = 1 FTE; three half-time students = 1.5 FTE, etc. NOTE 2: Retention & graduation rates are calculated using "First-Time, Full-Time Freshmen" as required by the U.S. Department of Education. In schools with large transfer populations, these rates can vary quite a bit from year to year. NOTE 3: Geographic distribution is reported for first-time degree/certificate-seeking undergraduates.
