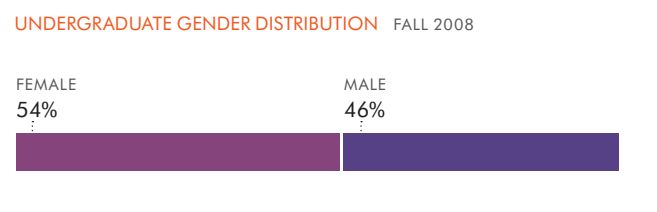

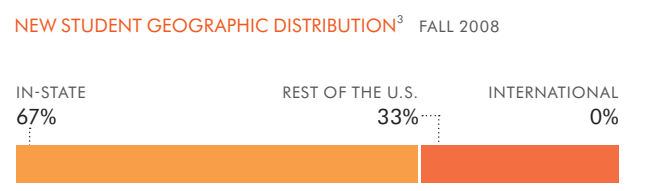

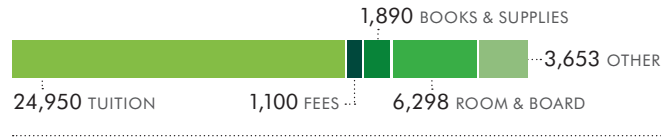

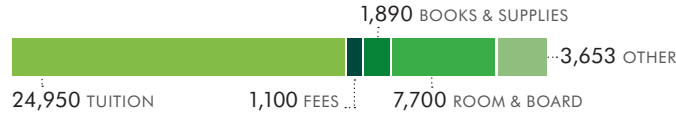

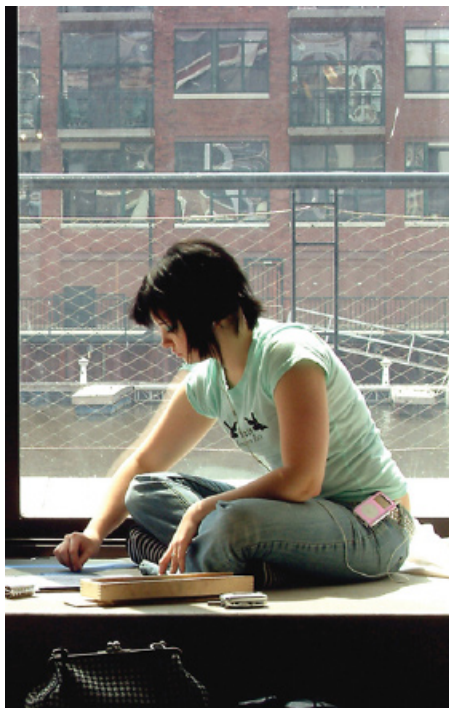

Let MIAD bring you to the forefront of global perspective with educational study abroad opportunities, both artistic and corporate internships, and a healthy diversity of culture with an international faculty and student body. Additionally, all students immediately benefit from receiving annual memberships to Discovery World and the Milwaukee Art Museum, a landmark featuring some of the most recognizable architecture in the United States.

Our Student Services center offers helpful financial aid, registration, and career services support in one centralized location. Students may also utilize an extensive library system, learning resource center, 3D Lab and computer facilities with professional staff eager to assist in their creative, educational paths.

Many full-time, BFA-seeking MIAD students take advantage of our partnership with Marquette University to add either a business or advertising minor to their degree. In addition, MIAD students can use the student health center, student union, and recreational athletic facilities as well as participate in intramurals sports at Marquette.

Every year, many of the most determined high school art and design students take part in our Pre-College Program, which provides instruction throughout the year and features two- and three-week summer sessions with on-campus residence.

NOTE 1: "Full-Time Equivalent" is the common way to measure the relative size of colleges. This adjusts for differences in the percentage of part-time students (or faculty). For example: one full-time student = 1 FTE; three half-time students = 1.5 FTE, etc. NOTE 2: Retention & graduation rates are calculated using "First-Time, Full-Time Freshmen" as required by the U.S. Department of Education. In schools with large transfer populations, these rates can vary quite a bit from year to year. NOTE 3: Geographic distribution is reported for first-time degree/certificate-seeking undergraduates. NOTE 4: Includes all institutional scholarships and grants, but does not include College Work Study or third party awards. NOTE 5: Data presented is drawn from the most recent school year available.
