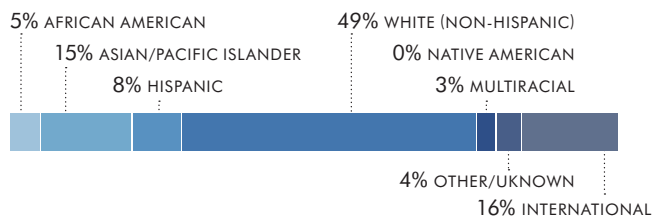

UNDERGRADUATE GENDER DISTRIBUTION FALL 2010



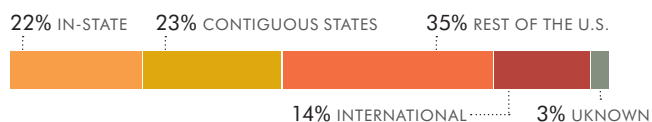

SIX-YEAR GRADUATION RATE²

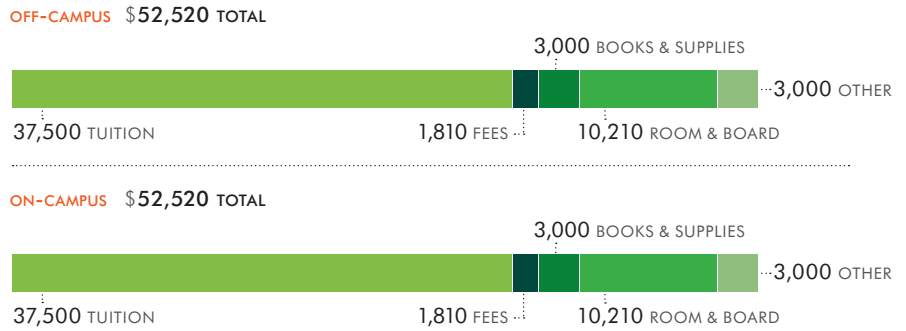

UNDERGRADUATE COST OF ATTENDANCE 2011-12

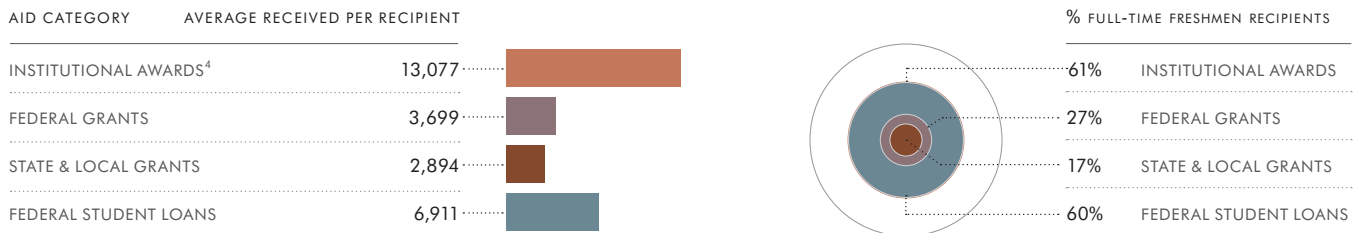

With so many programs from which to choose, students often major in one discipline and take electives in several others, exploring all their artistic interests.

Pratt's 1000 faculty members are successful practicing professionals who ensure the currency of the curriculum and connect students with internships and often jobs. The network of jobs for graduates stretches across the country and around the world, reflecting Pratt's vast alumni base with over 30,000 graduates. The Career Services Office provides students with online and in-person assistance with portfolios, resumes, interview skills, and the job search, listing hundreds of jobs online for the convenience of students and alumni.

The Brooklyn campus offers students 25 acres of beautifully landscaped grounds, historic buildings, outstanding studio facilities, five residence halls, an athletic center, varsity sports, and a contemporary sculpture park, recognized by *Public Art Review* as one of the 10 best campus art collections in the country.
