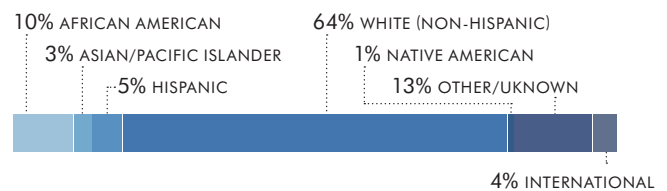

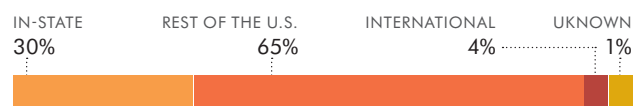

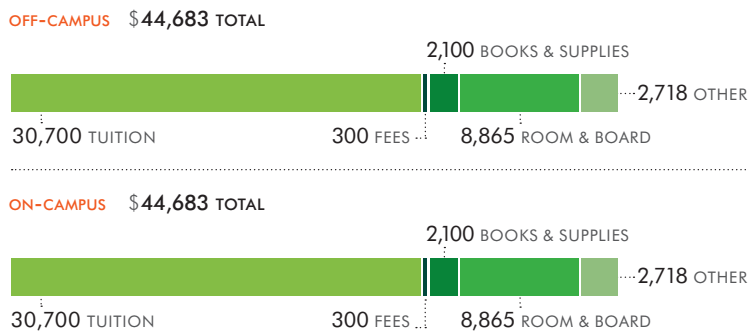

As the nation’s only comprehensive arts university (home to the College of Art and Design, the College of Performing Arts, and the College of Media and Communication), the University of the Arts offers a unique environment where students from many disciplines—artists, performers and media makers—interact in a dynamic community of creativity.

Its 2,400 students are enrolled in 46 undergraduate and graduate programs on the University’s campus in the heart of Philadelphia’s vibrant Avenue of the Arts. The institution’s roots as a national leader in educating creative individuals date back to 1868.

The University offers numerous opportunities for students to grow as creative individuals, including: internships; study abroad; an exchange program with The University of the Sciences in Philadelphia; a growing list of student clubs and organizations; a dedicated career services office; and an active alumni organization.

NOTE 1: “Full-Time Equivalent” is the common way to measure the relative size of colleges. This adjusts for differences in the percentage of part-time students (or faculty). For example: one full-time student = 1 FTE; three half-time students = 1.5 FTE, etc. NOTE 2: Retention & graduation rates are calculated using “First-Time, Full-Time Freshmen” as required by the U.S. Department of Education. In schools with large transfer populations, these rates can vary quite a bit from year to year. NOTE 3: Geographic distribution is reported for first-time degree/certificate-seeking undergraduates. NOTE 4: Includes all institutional scholarships and grants, but does not include College Work Study or third party awards. NOTE 5: Data presented is drawn from the most recent school year available.
